REGISTRATION:

No race numbers will be posted out before the event. These should be collected from registration on the Thursday evening. Registration for both events will open from 5pm, and will be located in the gazebo by the finish line on the meadow.

Your timing chip will be attached to the back of your race number.

TOILETS:

There are toilets available in the brick building at the park near to the registration area.

BAGGAGE:

We encourage runners to take any valuable items with them or leave them at home. There will be no facility to store baggage at this event.

WHAT TO BRING:


- Headtorch / handheld torch ESSENTIAL

THE RACES:

The 2k Family Fun Run will start promptly at 6pm, and the 5k event will start at 7pm. There will be a short, mandatory briefing before the start of each race. Please ensure you are at the start line by 5:55pm (2k run) and 6:55pm (5k run).

The routes will be marked using coloured signs with black arrows on. If you are completing the 2k route, you need to follow the **GREEN** signs. Those running the 5k route need to look out for the **YELLOW** signs. Both routes will also be well marshalled.







Please take care. Both routes are off-road, and you may encounter tree roots/stumps and uneven surfaces. There will be areas of the course which are lit, but **a torch is still an essential requirement for your run**. Marshals will be in Halloween fancy dress, and areas of the park will be decorated. The 5k route incorporates steps as part of the route and you may prefer to run in a pair of trail shoes if you have some.

Once you have finished you will be presented with a bespoke medal and Halloween-themed treats.



MEDICAL COVER:

Please ensure that you are fit enough to take on the challenge of completing 2k/5k, and that you are feeling well enough on the day to take part. Medical cover for the event is being supplied by Genesis Event Medical Services. They will be based at the start/finish area, but will be able to access the course if necessary. If you have any concerns during the run about either yourself or another participant, please let the nearest marshal know, who will be able to contact the race medic.

Our first aid team will have access to your medical and emergency contact details for the duration of the event only.

HEADPHONES:

No in-ear headphones will be allowed at this event as runners will need to be able to hear instructions from marshals on the course. Bone conducting headphones, that do not sit in the ears, are allowed.

PRIZE GIVING:

All runners will receive a bespoke medal for the event they run in, as well as Halloweenthemed treats following their run.

The first three male and first three female finishers of the 5k event will receive a trophy, as well as the first male and female finisher of the 2k event.

RESULTS:

Chip timing will be provided by Andrew Vickerman at <u>AVTiming</u>. Results will be available shortly after the event, and we will share the link to these on our social accounts once ready.

PHOTOGRAPHS:

We will have a photographer from Mick Hall Photos out on course who will be capturing your moments from the day, with images available free to download on his website shortly after the event.
